

The Mitsubishi Corporation Fund for Europe and Africa announces its funding programme for 2019

LONDON (2019) – Following its annual Meeting of Trustees on 1ST August 2019, the Mitsubishi Corporation Fund for Europe and Africa (MCFEA) has announced a programme of £300,000 in new grants.

The 2019 funding programme will give support to: Acumen's 'Fellows Program', designed to train up local change-makers committed to tackling poverty in West Africa; EAT's 'City Food Action in Africa Project' which seeks to reshape the food system by promoting sustainable solutions in African cities; Earthwatch Institute's 'Education and Capacity Development Project' which aims to raise public awareness around environmental conservation in the UK; Forum for the Future's 'School of System Change Project' which trains sustainability professionals on system change theories; International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)'s 'Mainstreaming Biodiversity Project' which seeks to integrate conservation practices into Tanzanian business operations; Rainforest Alliance's 'Sustainable Cocoa Farming Project' which trains farmers in Côte d'Ivoire on climate-smart agricultural techniques; Renewable World's 'Lighting up Lake Victoria Project' which delivers solar-power to off-grid communities in Kenya; and Springboard Entrepreneurship Development Initiative's 'Farm to School Africa Project' which addresses unemployment by offering farming and entrepreneurial training to young people in Nigeria.
